All you can be is your best, when you can.

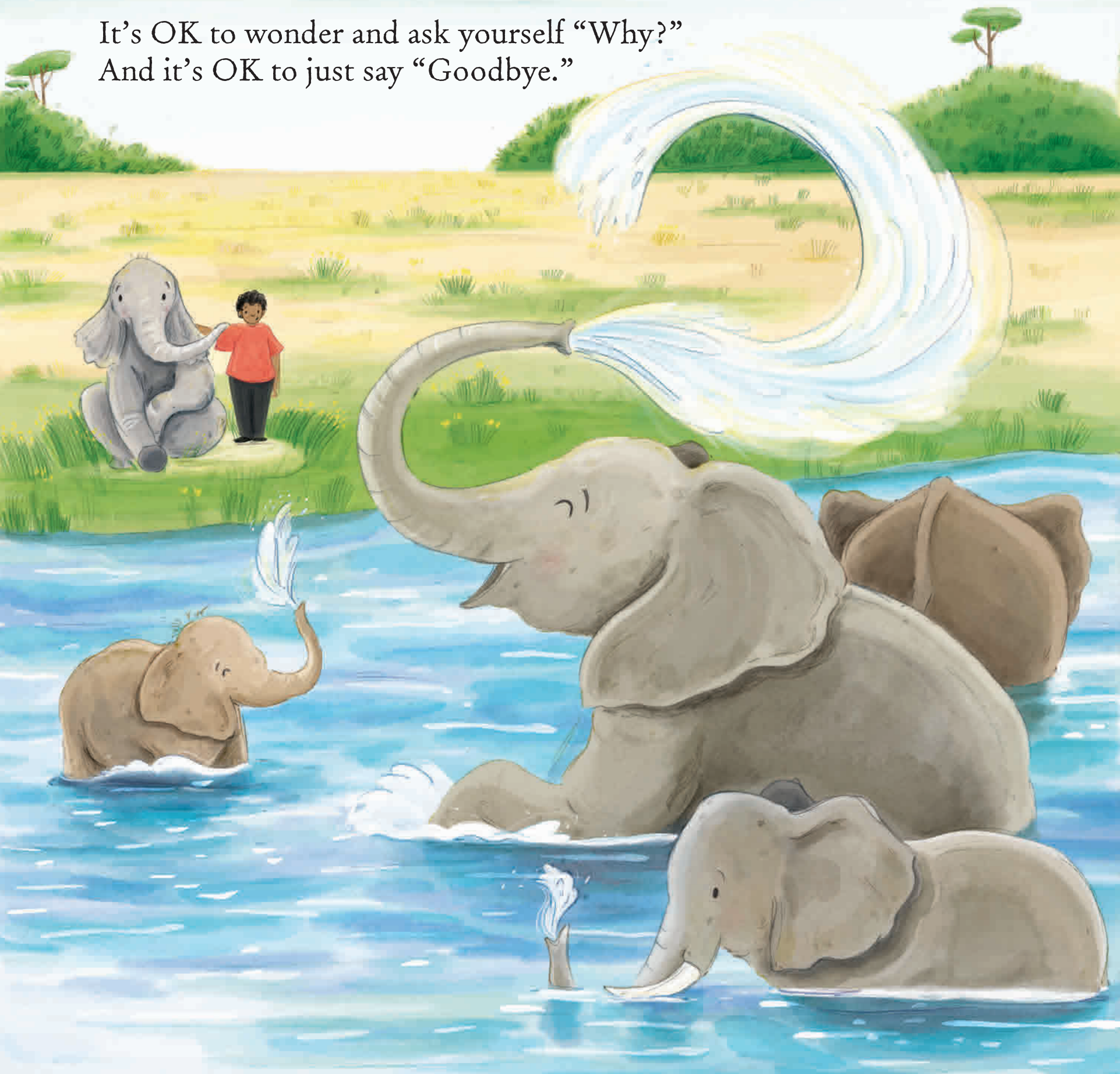
Be up.
