The world's largest windfarm, with over 7,000 turbines, is in Gansu, a remote part of China, next to the windy Gobi desert. RED ALERT Most turbines are painted white so they are easier for airline pilots to spot. In Germany, red bands on the blades indicate how near they are to airports. SEE THE LIGHT! One turbine close to the coast in the North European region of Frisia has been painted to look like a traditional local lighthouse. BAT SIGNAL Turbines are good for the planet, but can sadly be bad for birds and bats. Some have speakers to play highfrequency noises that scare bats away at night.
